62-109160-7575 KESSLER CLAIMED HE IS WORKING ON A STORY FOR THE WASHINGTON POST CONCERNING MEXICO CITY ASPECT OF ASSASSINATION INVESTIGATION. HE ASKED SA HOSTY QUESTIONS CONCERNING THE ORDER-TO DESTROY THE ROUGH DRAFT OF OSWALD'S LETTER TO SOVIET EMBASSY, IN WASHINGTON D.C. SA HOSTY ADVISED KESSLER THIS WAS A MATTER

KC 62-8156 PAGE TWO CONFIDENTIAL OF PUBLIC RECORD FROM TESTIMONY GIVEN BEFORE HOUSE JIDICIARY SUB COMMITTEE IN DECEMBER OF 1975 AND THAT HE STOOD BY HIS SWORN TESTIMONY IN THIS REGARD. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THIS REFERS TO COMMISSION EXHIBIT 103. HOSTY WAS THEN ASKED IF ORIGINAL LETTER WHICH IS COMMISSION EXHIBIT 15 WAS INTERCEPTED BY BUREAU PRIOR TO ASSASSINATION. SA HOSTY ADVISED HIM HE COULD COMMENT NO FURTHER THAN HIS TESTIMONY WHICH IS PUBLIC RECORD. KESSLER STATED HE HAD A LARGE NUMBER OF CIA DOCUMENTS ON THIS MATTER AND IMPLIED THAT CIA WAS COOPERATING WITH WASHINGTON POST IN THIS MATTER.

HE ASKED SA HOSTY FOR HIS COMMENTS CONCERNING THE MEMORANDUM WRITTEN BY SAC SHANKLIN TO ASSISTANT DIRECTOR BELMONT CONCERNING POSSIBILITY OF HOSTY LISTENING TO TAPES OF OSWALD TALKING TO SOVIET EMBASSY IN MEXICO CITY. SA HOSTY STATED HE WOULD MAKE NO COMMENT REGARDING THIS OTHER THAN PUBLIC TESTIMONY UNTIL CONSULTING WITH HIS SUPERIORS REGARDING THIS MATTER.

KESSLER STATED HE PLANNED TO GO TO MEXICO CITY NEXT WEEK ON THIS MATTER AND INDICATED HE WOHLD RECONTACT SA HOSTY PRIOR TO THAT TIME. WC 62-8156 PAGE THREE CONFIDENTIAL

ADVISED THAT HE WAS TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED BY RONALD KESSLER OF THE WASHINGTUN PUST NEWSPAPER AT HIS RESIDENCE UN UCTUBER 13, 1976 AT APPROXIMATELY NINE THIRTY PM CDST. KESSLER STATED HE HAS RETURNED FROM MEXICO CITY, WHERE HE CLAIMED TO HAVE INTERVIEWED PAST AND PRESENT CIA EMPLOYEES. KESSLER STATED HE IS NOW AWARE THAT THE CIA POSSESSED CONSIDERABLE INFORMATION ON THIS VISIT THAT WAS NOT FURNISHED TO THE FBI PRIOR TO THE ASSASSINATION. KESSLER WANTED COMMENTS FROM SA HOSTY RE THE POSSIBILITY THAT THIS WITHHOLDING OF INFORMATION BY THE CIA FROM THE FBI COULD HAVE BEEN DUE TO AN ALLEGED FEUD THAT FORMER FBI DIRECTOR HOUVER WAS HAVING AT THAT TIME WITH THE CIA. SA HOSTY DID NOT COMMENT ON THIS POSSIBILITY. KESSLER STATED THAT CIA EMPLOYEES DENIED THIS ALLEGATION OF A FEUD WITH THE FBI, STATING THE RELATIONS BETWEEN THE FBI AND CIA IN MEXICO CITY WERE EXCELLENT AT THE TIME.

FOR INFO BUREAU SA HOSTY WILL TESTIFY IF ASKED THAT IT WAS HIS UNDERSTANDING THAT RELATIONS WERE EXCELLENT BETWEEN THE FBI AND CIA IN MEXICO CITY, THIS INFORMATION BEING BASED UPON STATEMENTS MADE BY FURMER MEXICO CITY LEGAT CLARK ANDERSON BEFORE AN IN-SERVICE CLASS IN SEPTEMBER, 1963, TO THE EFFECT THAT RELATION WERE EXCELLENT.

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FOR FURTHER INFO BUREAU ATTORNEY BRAY FAVORS FURNISHING NO INFORMATION TO PRESS AT THIS TIME. BRAY FEELS THAT IT IS CERTAIN THAT SA HUSTY WILL BE CALLED BY THE NEWLY-FURMED U. S. HOUSE COMMITTEE TO TESTIFY AND WILL PROBABLY BE RECALLED BY THE SENATE INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEE TO TESTIFY. BRAY FEELS THAT THE LESS INFORMATION FURNISHED TO THE PRESS AT THIS TIME THE BETTER IT WOULD BE. ACCURDING TO BRAY'S INSTRUCTIONS KESSLER WAS REFERRED TO ATTORNEY BRAY FUR ANY FURTHER COMMENTS.

Previous communication advised that SA James P. Hosty, Jr., Kansas City Division, was contacted by Ronald Kessler, a reporter for the Washington Post on September 29, 1976. Kessler advised Hosty he is writing a story for the Washington Post concerning the Mexico City aspect of the Kennedy Assassination. He asked SA Hosty questions regarding Oswald's letter to the Soviet Embassy and the possibility Hosty had listened to tapes of Oswald talking to the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City. Hosty did not comment and advised Kessler he would stand on his testimony before the House subcommittee in December, 1975, regarding these questions. Kessler stated he had large numbers of CIA documents on this matter and implied that the CIA was cooperating with the Washington Post.

Attached advises that SA Hosty was again contacted by Kessler on October 13, 1976. Kessler advised Hosty that his review of CIA documents and interviews of CIA personnel shows that the CIA possessed considerable information on Oswald's visit to Mexico City in September - October, 1963, which it did not furnish to the FBI prior to the assassination. Kessler asked if it is possible this information was withheld because of an alleged feud between Director Hoover and the CIA. SA Hosty did not comment on this possibility. Kessler was referred by SA Hosty to John M. Bray, Washington, D. C., attorney, appointed by the Department of Justice to represent SA Hosty in this matter. Brav favors furnishing no information to the press at this time.


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


Kessler informed Hosty that he had talked with individuals familiar with the operation of the Intelligence Division at FBIHQ and had questioned them as to what FBI would have done had it been in possession of all information CIA had on Oswald's activities with the Soviets in Mexico. According to Kessler, such individuals advised him the FBI would have conducted a full espionage investigation.

Kessler stated information withheld by CIA indicated Oswald offered to furnish information to the Soviets and requested money and free passage for himself and his family to the Soviet Union via Cuba.
