Room SUBJECT MURKIN This case involves the murder of Martin Luther Nin Attached is Xerox copy of Memphis airtel dated 7/31/68 relating to investigation to identify two individuals, and or who checked into william Len notel, Memphis, Tennessee, at 2:38 p.m. on 4/4/68 and checked out at approximately 12:10 a.m. on 4/5/68. The circumstances surrounding their departure in Memphis shortly after the murder of King has warranted our investigation to identify these individuals since there is always the possibility that they may have been involved in the murder of King. Our investigation to date has been negative and the conclusion of Memphis is that both of these individuals were "running from something." There is also attached a memorandum from Mr. Rosen to Mr. DeLoach indicating that in view of the possibility that and may have been implicated as co-conspirators in the King slaying, that the fingerprints developed on hotel registration cards relating to them be compared with fingerprints of white Bureau fugitives between the ages of 29 and 35. In order to assist in the identification of it is suggested that consideration be given to contacting informants in the Klan and white hate groups since there is a possibility that these informants may be able to identify known militant members of the Klan or white hate groups who were not in their normal location on the day of and the day after King's murder. As a result of checking various hotels and motols in Eamphis, Tennessee, regarding suspects in this end enother by the name of poglatered at the William Lem Hotel in Lemphis on

Epril 4, 1968. On April 5, 1968, they made a hosty departure from the botol taking a taxicob to the Memphis Airport. Investigation strongly indicates that these two individuals departed Hemphis by Delta Airlines Flight No. 157, honstop to Fouston, Texas, on April 5, 1968, using the names of and

This matter has been thoroughly checked with negative results in order to determine the true identity of these individuals. It appears that those two indiwiduals may been in Resphis for the possibility of committing some illegal activity or there as possible fugitives "cooling off" and departed immediately because of the pressure of Inw enforcement on the King assassination.

Investigation conducted by Kansas City and San Francisco
Divisions determined that the addresses furnished by and
at the William Len Hotel were nonexistent. These Divisions
as well as Houston and Lemphis have been unable to identify
, or through contact with airline
personnel, transportation drivers, motel and hotel clerks,
credit and criminal checks, and through a review of street and
telephone directories in the pertinent cities involved.

The FBI Laboratory developed six latent fingerprints of value on Q349 which was the William Len Hotel registration card of and five latent fingerprints of value were developed on Q350 which was the registration card for

The FBI Identification Division developed

BRI # as a suspect possibly identical with

Who registered at the William Len Hotel. The
Latent Fingerprint Section of the FBI, Identification Division,
has advised that the latent prints developed on 0349 and 0350

are not identical with the fingerprints of

The FBI Laboratory has also advised that the
handwriting appearing on Q349 and Q350 is not identical with
the handwriting of FBI #

The William Len Hotel personnel advised that this is not identical with for the registered at the hotel on 4/4/68.

FEI # , was interviewed by a Buagent on 6/12/68 at St. Louis, Mo., and denied being in Memphis or ever flying via commercial airlines. Driver for the Yellow Cab Company transporting and to Metropolitan Airport, Memphis, advised that a photograph of FBI is definitely not identical with either of the two individuals that he transported to the Metropolitan Airport, Memphis, in the early a.m. of 4/5/68.

The Yellow Cab Company driver, William Len Hotel employees, and Delta Airlines employees advise that JAMES EARL RAY is definitely not identical with the two individuals that they had dealings with in Memphis on 4/4-5/68.

Although it is agreed that and departed the Memphis area in a somewhat suspicious manner on 4/5/63, many visitors and residents, immediately after KING was killed, departed the Memphis area by any means of transportation available due to the real existence of fear of the riot as a result of KING's killing. The Memphis Division conducted investigation regarding numerou persons who left the area after KING's killing and were merely two individuals of the large number of individuals who were under investigation as suspects prior to the identification of ERIC STARVO GALT at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, and subsequent identification of JAMES EARL RAY as being identical with ERIC STARVO GALT.

Due to the manner in which and departed the Memphis area and the lack of luggage at the time of their arrival and departure, it is believed that and were "running from something," possibly law enforcement and/or were in the city of Memphis for some type of illegal activity.

Since and furnished nonexistent addresses in San Francisco and Kansas City, Kansas, and it is believed that they actually changed names while in Memphis, it is not believed that any of the names used in Memphis by these individuals would be their true identities.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted or directed by the Memphis Division concerning the William Len Hotel phase in this matter.
