At yesterday's discussion of H.R. 160, the Resolution to carefully unfreeze some of the records of the Select Committee on Assassinations, it was surprising that no one even mentioned one overwhelming reason to vote for the Resolution, to wit: the Select Committee officially concluded that President Kennedy was murdered as a result of a "probable conspiracy"; yet, nearly five years having passed, no government agency (especially the Justice Department) is seriously trying to identify the conspirators.

As our Committee to Investigate Assassinations played a considerable role in both the establishment and work of the Select Committee, we wish to urge you to vote in favor of H.R. 106.
