Despite what the committee described as an "exhaustive and far-reaching field investigation," investigators were unable to identify signifi-cant associates of James Earl Ray other than his two brothers.

The report on the assassination of Pres. Kennedy that the House of Rep. spent \$5 million and took 21/2 years to produce will be released in a few days. What's in the report [illegible change] is leaking all over Washington. What the report says, in essence, is that another official myth perpetrated by our government is not true. The Warren Commission was wrong. Pres. Kennedy was probably not killed by Lee Harvey Oswald acting alone. There was more than one gunman. The assassination was a conspiracy, and organized crime probably had a hand it it. In other words, those crackpot assassination buffs were right all along and investigations - --eir ki90ry and --- b or purposely misleading. Both NBC and the N.Y. Times have sources on the Committee and each has issued a preview of the report. It will say there is still no smoking gun. No final evidence where the assassination was actually planned. But there is a substantial web of circumstantial evidence to link the death of the President to measurents of organized crime. Organized crime figures had vowed revenge on both John and Robert Kannedy. Both Oswald and Jack Ruby had syndicate connections. Phone records confirm Ruby's connections at the time of the shooting. Ruby had help from [line missing] when he appeared out of the crowd and shot Oswald on national television. And his entire aliba was a concoction by his lawyer. All this is in the report. The chief counsel for the Committee told the H-Y-Times Assoc. Press, "I think the mob did it" unquote. Cut and dried. Ancober staff number told NBC that there are still enough people alive that it would be possible to establish conclusively who killed Pres. Kennedy. But the House Committee has gone out of bisiness.. recommending that the Justice Dept. take over. That would be good enough for me.
