Glad your health problems have not been overwhelming and that you are as you say "hangintg tough."

How many years before Lorrie reaches 75 and then decides whether to continue working?

I'm at 83, closer to 84, am still working, although not for a salary.

We've had a few health problems this year, too.

I was twice hospitalized locally for congestive heart failure, the first time for two weeks and the second time they ambulance me to Johns Hopkins, where I was for another three weeks and four days. The list grew at Hopkins until the report sent to a local doctor had me treated for 10 different things, including kidney failure.

But I'm still working.

I've not called because I'm listening to my body and getting no more sleep. Much more. I'm usually abed by 4:30 p.m. and I am able to stay abed a little longer in the early morning.

I hope <sup>you</sup> can call earlier some afternoon when you get to work early.

If you can use your resources to get me the reports on the cross examination of Robert Broden in the Simpson case I'd appreciate it. All the Post carried is that he was labelled by the plaintiff as a conspiracy biff. In fact that is a compliment. I can't imagine it was no more than that. Or, the lawyer wasn't prepared. My hunch is that he either volunteered or was suggested by Oliver Stone
