

### Hughes Will Codicil <sup>Post</sup> 1.11.77

LOS ANGELES—The special administrator of Howard Hughes' estate was ordered to surrender to a Superior Court judge a document purported to be an amendment to the late billionaire's will.

Superior Court Judge Neil Lake gave attorneys for the administrator, Richard Gano, 15 days to turn over the codicil and also told them to give him a full report in 60 days on what they have done to find the original, missing will amended by the codicil.

Existence of the codicil was disclosed last week by Gano, Hughes' cousin, who said it was found last May in a wall safe once owned by a former Hughes attorney. The codicil, which was dated June 10, 1939, gave no information on disposition of Hughes' estate, Gano said.
