Dear Mr. Lesar:

In response to your Freedom of Information Act -Privacy Act request dated December 10, 1986, we searched both the electronic surveillance indices and the indices to the central records system of the Memphis Office. Based upon the information you furnished, we are unable to locate records identifiable with Mr. William Bradford Huie of Hartselle, Alabama, or <u>He Slew the</u> Dreamer and/or They Slew the Dreamer.

It is not quite clear from your letter whether you wish us to conduct separate indices searches for the names contained in paragraph five, page one, of referenced letter. For your information, all of the files dealing with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and his assassination have previously been processed and are available for public review in the Reading Room. An appointment can be made by contacting Ms. Helen Near, telephone 202-324-3762, in Washington, D. C. Advance notice of 48 hours must be given. Any information in our files concerning other individuals would require your obtaining a notarized authorization from each of those individuals.

In view of the above, no further action is being contemplated in this matter by this office.
