DALLAS, Aug. 27 (UPI) DALLAS, Aug. 27 (UPI) —H. L. Hunt, the oil bil-lionaire, has been sued by a former \$150-a-week secretary for \$5,894. The secretary charged that she was worked overtime 414½ hours without being naid for it.

414½ hours without being paid for it. Juanita Beavers filed suit in U.S. District Court Wednesday. The suit named Hunt personally, Hunt Oil Co. and the Hunt radio program, Life Line. - Line.

Line. She sued under the Fair Labor Standards Act, which provides time-and-a-half as overtime. She said that between Aug. 15, 1968, and Nov. 19, 1969, when she left the job, she had worked 414½ hours overtime without being paid. The suit demands \$2,197 in liquidated damages and \$1,500 in lawyers' fees.
