N.J. White Militant Seeks Coalition of U.S. Rightists

NEWARK, N.J., July 23 (UPI)—White militant Anthony Imperiale declared "war" on the 22-day-old administration of black Mayor Kenneth A. Gibson Wednesday night and said he would form a national conservative coalition "calling in the Birchers and everybody else."

"If racism means to be against Communists, to be against those who are for insurrection, to be against those who advocate anarchy, then I'm proud to say I'm the head of a racist organization," the beefy ex-Marine and karate expert told his North Ward Citizens Committee.

Imperiale, a former city councilman-at-large defeated in June's seven-way mayoral election, said his coalition would be on "conservative" groups who feel a state of emergency exists in the city less than a month after the first black mayor in its history took over. Gibson defeated

Hugh J. Addonizio, convicted Wednesday of shaking down city contractors, in a runoff last month.

Imperiale cited last Sunday's tussle between the Young Lords, a militant Puerto Rican group, and police at a Puerto Rican parade.

"We're sick and tired of people who give out their free breakfasts one morning and teach people how to kill the next afternoon," Imperiale told some 200 cheering supporters in Thomm's Restaurant, just down the street from the Lords headquarters.

Imperiale said his conservative coalition hoped to have branches in all 50 states and to meet in Newark toward the end of the year, late November or early December.

He said he would ask for a meeting between his group and the city council's six white members, but not the three blacks. Imperiale said the blacks "have already made it known they are anti-white."
