Negro, active in COME, arrived Lorraine Motel about 5:55 p.m. 4/4/68, in his car with Rev. James Orange and Rev. James Bevel. Parked car in Motel lot on east side of Mulberry, just south of old motel portion. Got out of car and saw King on 2nd floor balcony almost directly in front of room 306, which had been King's room during his recent visit to Memphis. King was leaning over rail. McCullough saw no one else on balcony. Walking back toward another car, McCullough heard explosive sound; he was standing and facing north. His position would be south of King who was facing west.

MCCULLOUGH, Marrell (continued)

Heard someone said King had been killed. Looked up. Saw King fall backward in southeast direction. McCullough ran to King and applied pressure on wound with a towel given to him by some one else. Relieved by Abernathy.

Saw no one running; knew of no suspects. Thinks bullet would have come from northwest.
