Information Unit Begins Campus News Service

The Information Council of the Americas (INCA) is sponsoring a national campus news service to counteract "new left" groups on campuses.

Richard E. Warren, executive director of INCA, said the business manager will be Larry I. Kihnel Jr., former Jefferson Parish intelligence detective, who infiltrated ranks of Students for a Democratic Society and testified before a Senate probe in Washington.

Pat Todaro, secretary of INCA, will be chief secretary for the service.

The service will start Nov. 1 and releases will be sent to universities throughout the United States.

The plan was announced today at a news conference at the Press Club of New Orleans.

"The major objective of the news service," said Warren, "is to get behind-the-scene facts to the news media and campus newspapers across the nation. Too often the headlines are of minorities capturing university buildings, primarily because the hard-working students who have blocked groups like SDS in the past have only been interested in getting an education and not in getting into the public eye.

"However, these students have a real story which is truly newsworthy. Instead of destruction many have constructed new avenues to legitimate protest on campus, establishing student-administrator working councils and there-

by taking much of the recruiting thunder away from the SDS."
