INCA Ladies Told to Study Red Tactics

Larry Kihnell, Jefferson Parish Sheriff's detective, has urged members of the Information Council of the Americas' Ladies Guild to "understand the nature of the beast" personified in college demonstrations across the country.

He told the women they undoubtedly would be criticized for countering moves by such radical groups as the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) but that the end product is well worth the effort.

Kihnell, who rose to authoritarian positions in the SDS while working under cover, said they should read the works of Marx and Lenin to acquire an understanding of the political motivation and tactical deployment of new left groups.

"Your concern with Communism should be survival," he told the members.

Another panel member, Loyola student Neal Deneaux, told the audience the SDS is very much present in New Orleans at such institutions as Tulane and Loyola.

Dr. Joseph Schlosser, a radiologist who serves as vice president of INCA, said "Tyrants are the main problem in the world today."

He said the action of tyrannical groups is to create conflict and the study of conflict management may be a solution to the threat of war.

Mrs. Joseph Schwertz, wife of the Fortier High School principal, said that at this time last year her family had heard practically nothing of SDS and pointed to disruptions of order at Fortier last year as evidence of SDS activity here.
