Oswald Portrait' New Wax Release

A recording certain to provoke interest in a wide cross-section of the public is Inca Records' "Oswald —A Self-Portrait in Red."

Made all the more timely because of District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation into an alleged New Orleans based plot to assassinate President Kennedy, "Self Portrait" is derived from a taped interview Oswald gave to radio a scant three months before the Dallas tragedy that stunned the world.

Oswald is heard expounding his views on Cuba, the C.I.A., the State Department, and gives his own opinion of the late president, whom the Warren Commission says was murdered by Oswald, acting alone.

Oswald's three years in the Soviet Union are also covered, and whatever view one has concerning the events that came to a climax in November of 1963, this recording will illuminate the personality of one of the most elusive figures in contemporary history.
