Submitted herewith are Xerox copies of two articles as they appeared in the "Memphis Press-Scimitar" on Friday, March 29. These articles both appeared on page 16 of this newspaper. Of interest to note, one is prepared by BARNES CARR and is captioned "After They Fell, More Blows Struck." The second article, pre-pared by JAMES R. REID, is captioned, "Bottles, Sticks and Rocks Are Hurled at Police." These articles are written by two regular Are Hurled at Police." Inese articles are written by two regular employees of the "Memphis Press-Scimitar" and yet they set forth what appear to be diametrically opposite views as to what trans-pired during the riot. It is of interest to note that one article alleges primarily police brutality, or at least the inference can be drawn from the article prepared by BARNES CARR.
