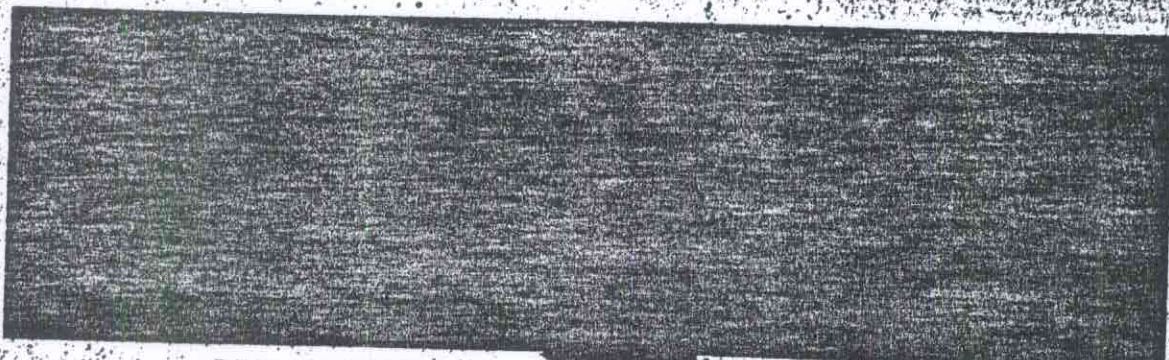

June 4, 1970.



JOHN C. SMITH

The above group talked about LANCE WATSON, since WATSON and KELLY DELANEY had gone to Little Rock, Ark. earlier (exact time unknown).

JOHN C. SMITH made a joke out of WATSON's going to Little Rock. He said, "I guess he has gone to talk up an Army."

11:15 AM TREZEVANT CARTER came to 1031 No. Watkins #3.

CARTER wanted the PEOPLE'S PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE to help CARY WALKER campaign in the Kansas Street area.

The PEOPLE'S PARTY will send out leaflets, posters, etc. for WALKER. The PEOPLE'S PARTY will also try to get the liquor store at Trigg & Florida moved.

11:45 AM TREZEVANT CARTER, MAURICE LEWIS, TYRANT MOORE and MICHAEL STARKS left 1031 No. Watkins #3.

12:05 PM TREZEVANT CARTER, et al, were observed at CARY WALKER's house which is located on Rutland Street. WALKER was not at home.

12:30 PM TREZEVANT CARTER, et al arrived at 1031 No. Watkins #3. Those present were:

10:45 PM IN CHCA was taken to the Gra Station where she car a bus for Knoxville. 5 15 BELL's girlfriend.

1:45 PM MAURICE LEWIS, etal, were back at 1031 No. Watkins #3.

During the afternoon, most of the gray at 1031 No. Watkins #3 were asleep.

4:00 PM SOURCE went home.

1031 No. WATKINS' LAY-OUT

Entering from Watkins on the east side of the building, directly in front of the door, approx. five feet, is a stairway that leads to the upper two bedrooms.

The front room contains:

- 1 bookcase during paperback books, lawbooks, old newspaper clippings re: SWEET WILLIE (on southwall)
- 1 studio couch which is against the east wall
- 1 chair against stairway on north wall
- 1 television set (black & white) in the southeast corner
- 1 mattress on floor in front of the television
- 1 closet (walk-in type) on the north wall under the stairway
- 1 blackboard on the west wall (messages are left on the blackboard)

To enter the next room, the dining room, go pass the bookcase (no door) on the south wall.

The dining room contains four chairs and a table.

The kitchen is north of the dining room through a swinging door. There is a refrigerator and a small stove in the kitchen.

Unstairs

At the top of the stairway, approx. four feet to the left, is a bathroom on the west wall.

The first bedroom is across from the bathroom on the east wall. The second bedroom is on the south wall (entrance faces the north). A bed, dresser and closet is in each bedroom.

REPORT () JUNE 4, 1970

8:00 PM SOURCE went by 2430 Volentine looking for JOHN C. SMITH but did not find him.

8:30 PM SOURCE arrived at 589 Richmond, JUANITA MILLER's house. Those present were:

TYRANT MOORE	MELVIN SMITH
ELGIE WILLIAMS	GHERDOLYN WHITE
JUANITA MILLER	JAMES THORNTON

MILLER and THORNTON were sleeping together.

This group sat around and listened to records until approx. 9:15 pm when WILLIE WARFORD and ROBERT ROACH arrived.

TYRANT MOORE told them what TRAZEVANT CARTER had proposed re: campaigning for CARY WALKER.

The PEOPLE'S PARTY don't think highly of CARY WALKER.

10:00 PM WILLIS BELL and JOHN C. SMITH came by 589 Richmond. BELL driving a government car (lic. unknown) dropped JOHN C. SMITH off.

JOHN C. SMITH ridiculed MELVIN SMITH as being afraid of women. SMITH just "laughed off" the accusations.

10:30 PM TYRANT MOORE, JOHN C. SMITH, WILLIE WARFORD, MELVIN SMITH and ELGIE WILLIAMS left 589 Richmond.

11:05 PM ELGIE WILLIAMS was taken home to a Norton St. address.

11:20 PM JOHN C. SMITH, MOORE, WARFORD, and MELVIN SMITH went to the "Toast of the Town" night Club. They drank three quarts of beer.

MELVIN SMITH and JOHN C. SMITH were trying to court the manager, BETSY (LNU) PH, 29, 5'7", 130#, med brn compl., "very attractive".

12:15 AM The group left. WARFORD was seen at McLenore and Leuderdale. MELVIN SMITH, MOORE and SMITH went to a little lounge on Third St. and drank a quart of beer.

12:45 AM MOORE, SMITH and SMITH left and went home.

The PEOPLE'S PARTY will campaign for WALKER at negro churches Sunday (June 7).
