On 5/9/68 J. TERRENCE WOLKERSTORFER, age 25, 🐞 , St. Paul, Minnesota, advised SA 🛔 at South Bend, Indiana, that he is presently attending the University of Notre Dame and is also working for "Ave Maria" magazine, which is published on the campus of the university. He advised that on 4/6/68 he and JOHN C. TWOHEY flew to Atlanta to cover the burial of MARTIN LUTHER KING for "Ave Maria" magazine. WOLKERSTORFER and TWOHEY rented a car 4/7/68 from the Hertz Corp. in Atlanta, and TWOHEY drove it to Selma, Montgomery, and eventually to Birmingham, Ala., where he left it on 4/9/68 and flew to Chicago the same day.

WOLKERSTORFER advised that he stayed at the American Motor Notel in Atlanta on 4/6 and 7/68 and then moved to the Sky Host Inn and stayed there until 4/9/68, when he checked out and flew back to Chicago.

WOLKERSTORFER advised that he did not see or hear anything concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING other than that which was published in the newspapers.

On 5/10/68 JOHN C. TWOHEY advised SA that he did travel to Atlanta with WOLKERSTORFER in order to gather material for an article on the life and death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, which was to appear in "Ave Maria" magazine. Mr. TWOILEY advised that he did not see or hear anything that would be of value to the FBI concerning the death of Mr. KING while he was traveling through the South.
