No bank account has been located for Galt but he did have a safe deposit box at the Birmingham Trust National Bank from September to December, 1967, when he wrote the bank in reply to a rental notice saying that he no longer needed the box. When applying for the safe deposit box he listed his nearest relative as Karl Galt, 2515 Lafayette Street, St. Louis. *hD*

An Alabama drivers license issued to Galt describes him as a white male, born 7/20/31, 5 feet 11 inches tall, 175 pounds, with brown hair and blue eyes.

Extensive investigation to date has failed to locate any other record of Galt. He is not known at Ingalls Ship Building Company at Pascagoula nor can any record be found of Karl Galt in St. Louis. There is no record of Galt at Social Security Administration, Baltimore, and no record has been found in the general or identification files of the Bureau. Extensive investigation is underway in all field divisions to check all sources including State Selective Service Headquarters, credit bureaus, etc., for any record of Galt.

The registration card from the motel and documents relating to the safe deposit box at the bank have been compared with the hand written signature of "Harvey Lowmeyer" on the invoice of the Remington rifle. Due to limited amounts of handwriting available a definite conclusion could not be made but similarities in handwriting were noted. Latent fingerprints developed on these documents are not identical with other latent fingerprints in this case or with the fingerprints of various prior suspects.

The safe deposit box in the Birmingham bank has not been re-rented and is being flown into the Laboratory for fingerprint processing. The motel room occupied by Galt has been processed and 25 latent fingerprints developed are being forwarded to the Bureau for comparison.

ACTION:

All-out efforts are continuing to locate and interview Galt.
