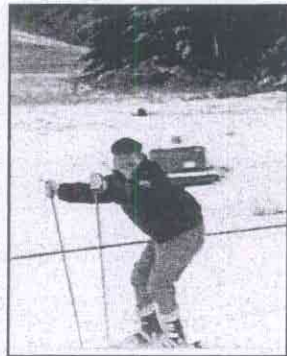

It was supposed to be a quiet Saturday evening at home. Jason was at the movies with a friend, and Barb and Juha were planning a quiet evening together. Juha had spent the day cleaning the garage and fighting acid indigestion...or so we thought. It was August 7th, and at 8pm, Barb called 911. It was a mild heart attack. Thanks to a great cardiologist and an angiogram procedure that revealed a 95% narrowing/crash ("the" heart attack) in one artery, they were able to place a stent (a wire mesh straw) in that spot and restore complete blood flow. The doctor credits getting to the hospital quickly and the fact that Juha had been taking aspirin regularly for this being a mild attack that left some flow to the bottom part

When the cardiologist came out of the operating room, he told Barb that Juha was not a heart patient, was no longer recovering from a heart attack, but was now recovering from the procedure. He was released from the hospital on Tuesday at noon with virtually no restrictions other than no driving for four days, no heavy lifting, and three weeks of rest at home.

We learned a few things from this experience. The good news is that the rest of Juha's heart is "gorgeous" - no sign of any other blockages, and we also learned that unscheduled time together at home is something every family should do every year for at least a few days. Plan some agenda free time for your family....it's invaluable. Sleep in, watch movies, play games and rediscover what family is all about.
