Dear John Jeorg,

It was good getting to meet you the other night. It is now only early-morning four days later but already it seems like a long time ago. There never is enough time for the essential dialogues, for the work, even for organization of work.

If you would like to help, as you suggested, there are several projects I know should be undertaken. Some might lead to worthwhile writing by those doing the research, particularly if it could be part of school work. It might even be that most of what I immediately have in mind could be done in the newspaper morgues, although personal interviews would certainly be a worthwhile addition in at least one case.

A study of Carlos Bringuier, the Cuban Student Directorate (DRE) and how it appeals for popular support, with what techniques and financing and what doctrine, would be valuable. This would go back to January 1, 1961. If one of your students should be willing to undertake this, I would supply a Xeroxed copy of his testimony. The student, after research, could practise an interview.

Another could be a study of the so-called "Information Council of the Americas". Still another, the Cordell Hull Foundation and how it helps Latin American students, including those who do not exist and others at non-existent addresses.

There is plenty of worthwhile summer work if the willing workers are available!
