### Former President, CBS Make Peace; He'll Be Back on Air

**CBS News** and Lyndon B. Johnson have patched up their differences and the former President soon will be resuming his taped-for-TV reminiscing, prompted as before by Walter Cronkite. Johnson and the network, after agreeing to a series of up to 17 hours of televised memoirs, had a falling out in May 1970 when the Texan insisted on deletion from his third interview, aired that month, of remarks relating to the Warren Commission findings in the John F. Kennedy assassination. Cronkite now plans to revisit the LBJ Ranch about Dec. 1 to get Johnson's reflections on past political events. "I doubt," says CBS producer Bud Benjamin, "that he will talk about the '72 campaign." The interview probably will be aired in January.
