JOHN RUSSELL FREEMAN OWNER AND EDITOR OF THE "FARMER AND MINER" A WEEKLY NEWSPAPER IN FREDERICK, COLORADO

John Russell Freeman, Frederick, Colorado, personally appeared at the Denver Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on May 28, 1965, and stated that Penn Jones, Jr. had telephonically contacted him today and stated that he had been contacted by Dallas FBI Agents today. Freeman stated Jones was very angry with him for furnishing information to the FBI and indicated that he did not divulge the names of the two high Government officials and apparently stated further that Jones informed him Dallas Agents handed him a 3-page, single-spaced FBI report containing Freeman's

He stated further that he believes Jones feels that if he tells the FBI the names of the two high officials in -Government, that this fact will get back to these officials and Jones fears for his life.

He stated further that Jones has also informed him on one occasion that when he is able to prove his theory that he will come to Frederick, Colorado, and he and Freeman will print the entire story in three weekly newspapers and then they would both hide out in the Rocky Mountains.

Freeman added that he may at some time in the near future furnish the identities of the two high Government officials to the FBI.
