

Hill Probe Of Justice Aide Asked

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Aug. 12 (UPI)—Representative Henry B. Gonzalez (D-Tex.) says he has a bill of impeachment ready to file against assistant U.S. Attorney General Will Wilson unless Wilson is investigated in connection with a Texas stock scandal.

Gonzalez has made more than 20 speeches from the House floor attacking Wilson, accusing the former Texas Supreme Court justice and Attorney General with having "compromising connections" with a man accused of masterminding of a fraudulent stock scheme in Texas.

Gonzalez said he will ask Representative Emmanuel Celler (D-N.Y.) after the congressional recess ends next month, to use his judicial administration committee to investigate Wilson.

Gonzalez has accused Wilson of owning stock in National Bankers Life Insurance Co. of Dallas, a now bankrupt firm the Securities and Exchange Commission has accused of illegal stock manipulation in a lawsuit. Wilson did he owned NBL stock, but sold it before he took his Justice Department job in Washington in early 1969.

Gonzalez also said Wilson worked as a lawyer for bankrupt Houston stock dealer Frank Sharp, the man the SEC suit says was boss of the complex stock scheme. Sharp was granted immunity from prosecution in exchange for his testimony by federal prosecutors.

Wilson has said he had nothing to do with the Sharp case and in fact declared himself ineligible since he had worked as an attorney for Sharp.
