When his family asked for a new look at the "ing assassination I wrote you on the hope of helping you avoid another political decision that would again disgrace the country, your department and its FBI and you as the one in ultimate responsibility. Your reported decision to limit this investigation to "new evidence" is such an unfortunate, such a worng and hurtful decision and there is no whoring with our history by the commercializing Gerald Posners that can change this.

I wrote the first and still basic book on that assassination. I then became Ray's investigator. I condicted the investigations for the successful habeas corpus petition and then for the two weeks of evidentiary hearing. The evidence I produced in that priceding, as used by the lawyers, led that judge to hold that guilt or innocence were not before him because that evidence did exculpate Ray. I then filed FOIA CA 75-1996 to being Department and FBW related records to light. In that lawsuit the Department actually persuaded that judge that in order to comply it required my services as its consultant, for which it told that judge it would pay me at its consultant rates, and that judge had me served as the department's consultant in my lawsuit against it! Only to have the department defraud me of that fee by telling that judge there was no authority to pay me. This is to indicate to you that I am a subject@meatter expert.

I think it is fair to state that this lawsuit led to the OPR inquiry.on King,
The last think the country needs is abother whitewash and eliminating the
Department and its FBE's record assures just that and the inevitable disillusion—
movent from it. Which is what your reported decision assures.

I am sorry my typing cannot be any better. I am also sorry that when a man of 85 and in impatied health takes the time to write you that nobody in your office can extend the common courtest of at least an acknowledgement of receipt.

An honest and meaningful inquiry should begin by determining whether Ray's extradition was procured by perjury and the subornation of perjury, as I think, without any doubt at all, it was. And it goes downhill from there. And you have reportedly decided to whitewash this. In this you also write your own history.
