Dear Sir,

In his letter of November 4, received yesterday, your Deputy has refused my requests under S.L.R.C. § 522 (in language) "all information about and FBI reports concerning Honolulu Saigon, questioned Sir Lee Ufan Committee" and "whose fingerprint was discovered by the FBI on a leaflet which, you assert, Lee Harvey Oswald distributed."

None of these requests were fully and completely and accurately described in earlier correspondence. There is no question of ever having been "identifiable records." I have also filed the D.W.I.C. form, this much.

The reason given for rejecting those requests is "that the information you are seeking is contained in investigatory files compiled for law enforcement purposes."

I write this letter, in conformity with law and Departmental regulations, as my appeal from this erroneous rejection of part of my complaint is a proper pair of requests, neither of which can be withheld for the reasons given me.
