My request was for the background data that the F.B.I. had. I did not ask for the Bowle's piece on the agent's interviews of Bowles, but I suppose the original request was broad enough to cover them. Consequently, by a copy of this letter, I am asking Jim Lesar, who is representing me in the suit, to ask for them.

The NSF is not subject to FOIA. Lombardo v. Handler, 397 F. Supp. 792 (D.C. D.C. 1975), affirmed without opinion, 546 F.2d 1043 (D.C. 1976), cert. denied, 431 U.S. 932 (1977).

I considered suing them some time ago. But never fear, Stokes has asked them to keep records and to make them available to the Congress when it reviews the Panel's work. Ramsey told Stokes they would comply with his request. It will be interesting to see to what degree they live up to his word.
