Dear Mr. Weisberg:

By letter dated September 17, 1978, you raised with me the matter of certain materials which had come into your possession as a result of C.A. 75-1448. By memorandum dated October 5, 1978, a copy of which I have already furnished you, I requested Mr. Robert L. Saloschin, Director, Office of Information Law and Policy, to cause a search to be made within both O.I.L.P. and the Office of Legal Counsel for any possibly relevant records.

I have now been advised by Mr. Saloschin that searches of the records of the two offices have been conducted, but have failed to disclose any records. As you know, I furnished Mr. Saloschin with both your letter of September 17 and the two enclosures thereto which were marked "Exhibit 12" and "Exhibit 17," to ensure that the individuals conducting the searches would have available to them all of the information you furnished me.

Based on the foregoing facts, it appears to me that there are no records which can be located at this time. I regret that I have been unable to assist you in this matter.
