I deeply regret the continuing delay in the matter of government records Mr. Harold Weisberg is entitled to and seeks. Because we are anxious to be as cooperative as possible, we will further delay for a short time the filing of an action in the hope that the need for it may yet be eliminated.

This also provides an opportunity for your supplying my client with two other government records he has requested and has not received. These are (1) the spectographic analyses of the bullet (Warren Commission Exhibit No. 399) and fragments of the bullet as said to have figured in the assassination; and (2) all records relating to the weight and weighing of this bullet and these fragments at various stages of the preparation of the evidence for the Warren Commission.
