Because of the need to redirect the focus of my work I've been to the Archives little lately. When I found something good they'd reclassify it and ~~swear~~ I'd never seen it, so it became futile.

I don't believe they've notified me of any new declassifications.

I did get the Nosenko file.

But what you speak of I'm not aware of. I'd appreciate any copies, notes etc that you can spare.

I doubt the Oswald marriage story very much. Is it that Rankin repeated a report? He had to know better. However, the report itself may be interesting.

If any papers any of you see carried the AP's story on the 1/22/64 executive session transcript I finally got I'd appreciate copies just to file and partly because not one of the papers seen by most Members of Congress carried it.

I gave it to AP last week. They put the story on the wire Saturday afternoon for evening radio and Sunday papers.

Was there a list of the papers declassified beginning in 1971? Besides the delayed 1970 declassification of something like 2,000 pages?

While there is not much you can do with so enormous a store of materials in so short a time I'm sure the experience was good for all of you.


Dear Mr. Weisberg:

I just came back from the National Archives on May 7, 1975, along with my wife, Barbara, and Professor Terry Ripmaster of the History Department at William Paterson College.

We checked the declassified materials on the John F. Kennedy Assassination from 1971 to 1975. As we all walked out of the Archives, on our way to the White House, we remarked about how much work you must have done to present your "White Wash" books.

We're also pushing hard to get your series in local bookstores. I only have the IV Book. I'm wondering if you've seen the declassified memos, etc. from that date of 1971-75. If so, what do you make of Rankin's memo that Oswald was married in Fort Worth? Perhaps nothing big, but a possible "something".
