The copy of WHITEWASH II my wife sent you on April 27 is a first edition. With respect to the limited edition of WHITEWASH, without checking what I have stashed away, I estimate that I have perhaps a half-dozen and, frankly, I had not thought of selling them because I think ~~as~~ as time goes on they will have considerable value. Aside from interest in the field, it is the first book on the subject and I am not particularly modest in my opinion of what it has accomplished.

I have not considered selling any of them immediately because I think that when ultimately we get the truth these few copies will have a greatly enhanced value. If you are familiar with the literature in the field, you know that all of the other books collectively add nothing essential to its revelations and collectively do not begin to approximate its content.

I do have perhaps 100-150 copies of the first general printing (there were four prior to the Dell reprint, the smallest of which was of 5,000) should this interest you.


