I hope you have a good understanding of what you are getting into.

One of the most important and one of the earliest of the critics was the late Sylvia Meagher. Her records are at local Hood College, where all of mine will be. Some are now.



May I suggest that you have a clear idea of what you mean by critic? Do you mean to include a few who did very little and then disappeared, for example, those who published nothing? Will you go into the subsequent careers of some? Where does "early" leave off or end?

I like the idea for your thesis. I hope you are prepared for it and understand what has happened since those earliest days.


Dear Mr. Weisberg:
