Former Special Agent MILTON R. KAACK advised on 12/19/75 that he was contacted by DANIEL F. DWYER and EDWARD F. GREISSING of the Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities. Former SA KAACK advised that these investigators had questioned him regarding the Fair Play for Cuba Committee in New Orleans, about the LEE HARVEY OSWALD case, and Cuban activities in the New Orleans area. KAACK stated that these investigators inquired as to why OSWALD was not put on the security index. They also asked him if he thought it was strange he was transferred in March or April, 1964, following the investigation of the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

These investigators left with former SA KAACK two documents; one entitled Rules of Procedure for the Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities, United States Senate, adopted 4/9/75, and amended 9/22/75. The other was a resolution to establish a Select Committee of the Senate to conduct investigation and study with respect to intelligence activities carried out by or on behalf of the Federal Government, which is Senate resolution number 21.
