One of these things was a misplaced box of Penn Jones' newsletter and near it a file hex of ceptes of FRIER records apparently made by Rac, so you can guine how long ago that was because she hasn't been here for years. I have two immediate purposes, one being how unusual it is for these boxes to have been moved at all, and certainly they were not by idl or me, and the other relates to the record a copy of which I'll attach because of its potential importance in any field offices case remand.

The only person to look at any of my downstairs files at all recently was the Penn State dectoral condidate and to the best of my recollection I was with him all the time, to call things to his attention and to answer his questions. His interest is limited to the Commission file and this was not near that, which is in the center rather than along the wall toward the pool, where these boxes were.

The Penn Jones namesage was an open box atop a full bex. It is the upper or open box that was moved. If the lower one was moved, at was not moved much and I did not notice if it was. The box of cepies was upright and next to the TCI bease. It was moved farthur to the left, and whether or not there is any significance, it happens that both partially blocked a coller window, which tilts in from the top. Strange, and I cen't explain it. I am cortain that nobody who has been here had any interest in the "ones stuff and if I ever knew of the other bax, of copies, being there, I'd forgetten it. So, nobody could have had any interest in it.

The main reason for attaching the MR of 62-109060, New Legat to HQ, 1/14/69, is that it lists a copy for M. 89-52, captioned "Assessination of JFK." This indicates an entirely different DL JFK assessination file that has been admostledged and it had not been searched.

The '(is not clear, but no classification in the 80s could be appropriate for this subject matter. I've checked the list. The 52 is clear enough. And there is no correction on the record, which would be indicated if there had been a typegraphical error. Moreover, a type would involved both digita, for the known assummination file in DL is 43.

Bob Kaffka, the subject of ignored appeals, relating in particular to critics and to me personally, was a member of Hal Verb's group in the Bay wrea and also an TMI "security" informant. His SF number is indicated. 134-2373. He is also filed in NY in 134-19774.

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The January 6, 1969, edition of EL DIA, a leftist, Spanish language daily newspaper published at Mexico, D.F., Mexico, carried an article on page 2 which is set forth below in its entirety:

Mr. William R. Dobkins, United States citizen, from San Francisco, California, presented himself last night in the offices of EL DIA and asked us to publish the following declaration:

"The 24th of December I, together with my compatriot Roberto Kaffke, visited the Embassy of the Republic of Cuba, displaying to its functionaries an invitation made to us from Havana to visit Cuba at an unspecified time. Our purpose, as representatives of the Caucasian groups and of the Third World, respectively, of the strike committee of the students of San Francisco State College, was to obtain national and international publicity for our strike and for the plan for a new course in the psychology department of our school to study the mental state of

Lee Earvey Cswald. The trip to Cuba was refused to us, although in Canada it had already been authorized." (They were deported from there.)

"This study which we wish to carry cut has the objective," stated Mr. Jobkins, "of determining why Cswald was not tried. It is sustained that the motive for his action (the assassination of John 7. Kennedy) was so damaging for North American capitalism that he had to be eliminated.

"My only credentials are the fact that I convinced his mother (Margarita Cswald) that I knew so much about the affair that she herself me of having been involved in the assassination of the President, without mentioning my name, the day following the death of Jack Ruby." (Se showed a photostatic copy of a document in which there is a quotation which, according to the declarant, was taken from the DALLAS MCRNING NEWS, November 5, 1967: "That she now had enough circumstantial evidence to convict a person with a motive.")

"Cnce I spoke with her in Fort Forth, Texas, and another time she saw me, and we spoke, in ionahans, also in Texas, and what we spoke of there, and much more, is that which we wish to say in our new course in San Francisco State College and for which we desired ample publicity which I believed I could obtain with a grand unfolding in Suba."

Mr. Dobkins identified himself with a migratory Form 14 number 297747 issued by our Consul in Calexico, California.
