Synopeles Canadian Consul, New Orleans, La., advised that on 10/10/63, Rev. ALBERT ALEXANDER OSBORNE applied for and received a new Canadian passport valid until 10/10/68. Home address furnished as 1441 Doummond St., Montreal, Canada. OSBORNE claimed to be in transit and Consulate received letter from him 10/18/63 from Mexico. OSBORNE unknown at Jung and New Orleans hotels and to Baptist leaders in New Orleans. SHIRLEY LAMPRECHT, New Orleans, advised that ROLAND SPEDALE, New Orleans Public Service, Inc. (NOPSI), advised her that shortly after the assassination of President KENNED? that the FBI had checked the records of NOPSI regarding gas and electric service to the apartment which had been occupied by OSWALD, and that no mention was made in the conversation re JACK RUBY. She repeated this conversation at a party at the home of Mrs. VINCENT LOCOCO. JOHN CIRAVOLO, JR., recalled OSWALD being in the Moisant unit of the CAP, but could not recall anything else about him. ALBERT GUY BOGARD has poor credit record, Shreveport, which includes eight collections and five judgments, but not known to have been involved in any fraudulent insurance claims.
