With all the trouble you have had, I just want you to know how beautiful your daughter was, erect, eyes flashing, with her pride in her father. I am grateful to her for coming up after my speech last night, grateful that she heard part of what I usually say and do believe.

You are entitled to be as proud of her as you must be.

I asked her to show and explain certain things to you. I hope she understood them and was able to make them understood to you.

Should you at any time want to know anything you think I might know that is of interest to you, you need only ask me. You will be under no obligation and I will ask nothing of you in return. Whatever you might ask of me I will keep in confidence. There is nothing I would tell you that you would have to keep confidential.

And so you will have no doubt of what I believe, for I have said it often, in public, including on both radio and television, I believe all of the late President's escort are brave and dedicated men who were in no way responsible for the tragedy. I wish the record had been left less beclouded.
