Walker said yesterday he wanted to get "first-hand information" by talking to anyone on the scene of the street battles-delegates, bystanders, media workers, demonstration

leaders, city officials.

His staff, he added, will examine film footage and stills and may be sent to interview student demonstrators at colleges or in their home towns.
