Backs Warren Report 68

LOS ANGELES, March 25 (AP)—Students asked Senator Kennedy today whether or not he would, if elected, disclose all materials—now stored in United States archives—used by the Warren Commission in investigating the death of his brother, President Kennedy.

In apparent discomfort, Senator Kennedy coldly told the shouters: "Your numbers overwhelm me. Go ahead, go ahead—ask your question."

He said the archives would be opened "at the appropriate time" and that he stood by the commission's findings that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, shot President Kennedy.

He said, "I would not reopen the Warren Commission report. I stand by the report."
