However, I am impelled to repeat my earlier caution against any Keanedy family involvement in any of these things.

Par tic ularly now, when so many self-serving records of the past are becoming available and are being token as other than self-serving.

In amplification of what ¹ have told you in the past and as an update on the old spectro suit that figurad in the 1974 FOIA amendments, the sec ond batch of FBI records, released 1/19/78 contain, among those not given to the Marren Commission and not provided to me under disc overy in the current version of that suit an open admission about the shot that missed. It is that while at the time of the orime there was visible physical damage to the curbstone where it struck by the time the Marren Commission got around to asking the FBI to conduct the investigation of this that it had avoided no physical damage was visible. You may recall that I also had "before" and "after" pictures showing this in Post Mortem. The difference e is that now there is proof of official awareness of this destruction of evidence. Going along with this is the FBI's reported destruction of that one spectrographic plate only. We learned this on discovery. The FBI tried to attribute this disappearance e to systematic destruction of old records to save space. Aside from what else makes this impossible to believe, given the nature of the orime and the preservation of all the other plates, any plate takes only about an eighth of an inch of file space.

The clippings were sent to me by the wife of the man injured slightly by that missed shot. He and she are friends of mine. He provided an affidavit I used in the new suit, C.A. 75-226.
