ON HER deathbed, Jackie Onassis had one strange, final wish – and it was secretly granted, family insiders tell Sun. 

it lay in the bank. On No-niversary of JFK's death, a se-nior bank employee reported seeing the misty shape of a man, his head bent in sorrow, standing in the middle of the yault. The employee, a mid-dle-aged manager, said later that he thought the man was JFK, drawn to the garment that bore his blood. Two days after Jackie's death - at age 64 - on May 19, 1994, the suit was finally re-moved from the yault and taken to her apartment on Manhattan's Park Avenue.
