**First 300 GIs
In S. Vietnam to
Leave Today**

SAIGON, South Vietnam, (UPI)—Three hundred U.S. military advisers departed for the United States today, beginning the first of three shipments by the end of this year.

Departure of the 300 men will reduce to 15,500 the U.S. troop complement in South Vietnam.

An Army spokesman said none of those being sent home are advisers to actual Vietnamese combat units but are training technical, logistics and support elements.

GO PILOTS REPLACED

The group leaving Tuesday from Tan Son Nhut Airport outside Saigon includes 30 U.S. Air Force officers who were flying as copilots in Vietnamese transport planes. Vietnam Air Force pilots have been trained to replace them, the spokesman said.

TEND AMERICAN DIES

The 10th combat victim was an enlisted man killed when the Viet Cong ambushed a convoy Sunday night near the American border. Another American was seriously wounded and nine Vietnamese troops were wounded. The ambush occurred about 60 miles west of Saigon.

American sources said the victims were special forces men. They were riding in the rear of a truck on the Binh Xuyen area when the guerrillas detonated a mine under the vehicle. The truck was filled with automatic weapons. The first truck in the convoy passed safely.

PLEDGE U.N. SUPPORT

South Vietnam's Military Government today pledged its support to the principles of the United Nations Charter and the Declaration of Human Rights, including freedom of religion and the press.

A similar statement was made by ARVN's Chairman Maj. Gen. Nguyen Van Minh in a letter to U.N. General Assembly President Costa Rodriguez. The text was released by the government.
