## Joseph P. Busch Jr. Dies at 49; District Attorney in Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES, June 27-District Attorney Joseph P. Busch Jr., of Los Angeles Courts who oversaw the largest district attorney's office in the country, died in his sleep last night at his West Covina home. He was 49 years old.

A spokesman for the district attorney's office said that the cause of death had not been determined, but it was believed that death came from natural

causes.

Mr. Busch was appointed Dec. 1, 1970, filling the unexpired term of his friend Evelle Youn-ger, who had been elected the State's Attorney General. Mr. Busch's appointment capped an 18-year career with the district attorney's office, whch began in 1952, immediately following his graduation from the Loyola University School of Law here.
