Sirhan Lawyer to Seek Another Trial Delay

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The attorney for Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, charged with murdering Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, notified Superior Court yesterday he will seek another trial postponement.

Russell E. Parsons filed a motion asking to appear before Judge Herbert V. Walker, who will preside over Sirhan's trial, at Walker's convenience to request continuance until after Jan. 2, 1969.

Sirhan, a 24-year-old Jordanian, is set to stand trial Dec. 9.

Meanwhile, it was learned some newsmen will watch the trial on closed television in a room three floors below the trial court.

Superior Court Judge Herbert V. Walker said yesterday this would be necessary because of the small size of the heavily guarded courtroom where Sirhan will be tried on a charge of murdering Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

Walker said all news media that had applied for seats would receive them in either the main courtroom or in the auxiliary courtroom.

"We are fully cognizant of the fact that the eyes of the nation, as well as the world, will be on this trial," Walker said. "We want the news media to have the best possible facilities to do a fair and accurate job of reporting to the public."
