Man Arrested At RFK Funeral Is Given Hearing

NEW YORK, July 9 (AP)—A man who was arrested with an unloaded gun at St. Patrick's Cathedral on the day of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy's funeral said in court today that he had offered to surrender the gun to three police officers, but none could tell him where to turn it in.

The defendant, Gary Dedell, 30, of Syracuse, N.Y., said in an affidavit filed in Criminal Court that when he finally showed the gun, which he was "arrying in an attache case, to a plainclothes detective at the Cathedral door, he was taken to a police station, questioned for four or five hours, then advised he was under arrest.
