

Sirhan Acted Alone, Prober Says

LOS ANGELES — A report by an independent investigator says there was no evidence "of any nature" that Sirhan Sirhan did not act alone in carrying out the 1968 assassination of Robert F. Kennedy.

"Eyewitness testimony, ballistics and scientific evidence, and over 6,000 separate interviews conducted by numerous police and intelligence agencies over the past eight years all substantiate the fact that Sirhan acted alone," the report submitted yesterday concluded.

Thomas F. Kranz, a Los Angeles lawyer appointed as a special counsel to investigate the killing of the brother of the late President John F. Kennedy, submitted the report to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.
