

RFK Ballistics Report Monday?

LOS ANGELES — Results of a reexamination of ballistics evidence from the Robert F. Kennedy assassination may be disclosed publicly Monday afternoon, Deputy County Counsel Robert Lynch said yesterday. He said seven experts continued to work behind the locked doors of a jury deliberation room, reviewing materials and writing their reports.

If they finish work on schedule, Lynch said, a report will be presented to Superior Court Judge Robert A. Wenke, who would release the findings at a hearing, probably Monday afternoon.
