

PANEL TO QUESTION SIRHAN GUN EXPERTS

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 28—The seven firearms experts who concluded that they found no evidence to support a "second gun theory" in the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy were scheduled today to be cross-examined next month.

Judge Robert A. Wenke of Los Angeles Superior Court, who last Aug. 14 ordered a re-examination of the gun and bullet evidence used to convict Sirhan B. Sirhan of the 1968 assassination, set Nov. 17 and 18 for the hearing.

The cross-examination was requested by John Van De Kamp, the newly appointed Los Angeles County District Attorney, who said he wanted "to avail himself in assuring that the findings [of the experts] are accurate."

It was also announced today that Allard K. Lowenstein, the former New York Representative, would replace Meldon Levine, a lawyer representing Paul Schrade, during the nearness hearings. Mr. Schrade and the CBS television network asked for the re-testing of evidence.

Mr. Schradt said that Mr. Levine's "tremendous backlog of work" in other legal matters forced the replacement. However, shortly after the experts' findings were disclosed early this month,
