PANEL TO QUESTION SIRHAN GUN EXPERTS

LOS ANGELES, OCt. 28—The seven firearms txperts who concluded that they found no evidence to support a "second gun theory" in the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kenton of Senator Robert F. Kento nedy were schedultd today to be cross-examined next month.

Judge Robert A. Wenke of Los Angeles Superior Court, who last Aug. 14 ordered a re-txamination of the gun and bullet evidence used to convict Sirhan B. Sirhan of the 1968 assassination, set Nov. 17 and 18 for the hear.

The cross-examination was requested by John Van De Kamp, the newly appointed Los Angeles County District Attor-ney, who said he wanted "to avenue in assuring that the findings [o the exptrts] are accurate."

It was also announced today that Allard K. Lowenstein, the former New York Representative, would replace Meldon Levine, a lawytr representing Paul Schrade, during the near-ness hearings. Mr. Schrade and the CBS television network asked for the re-testing of evidence.

Mr. Sohradt said that Mr. Levine's "tremendous backlog of work" in other legal matters forced the replacement. However, shortly after the experts' findings were disclosed early this month.
