POLICE ASKED' TO OPEN FILES ON RFK ASSASSINATION — Several persons, including a man seriously injured as he stood near Sen. Robert Kennedy when he was shot in June 1968, have asked the Police Commission to open its files on the assassination to the public. "I have the legal and moral right to learn if anyone other than Sirhan Sirhan was firing a gun in there," Paul Schrade told the commission. "I have that right as a victim of that assault who was nearly killed." Schrade was joined by CBS-TV and former New York Congressman Allard K. Lowenstein, who has been pushing for a reopening of the Robert Kennedy assassination case.
