## RFK evidence missing

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — At least two pieces of evidence in the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy have been destroyed or are missing, according to Dion Morrow, a special counsel in the city attorney's office. Morrow says bullet-scarred panels from the Ambassador Hotel's pantry, where Kennedy was killed in 1968, were destroyed a year later and the left sleeve of the slain senator's coat is missing. A judge last week ordered a new ballistics study in an effort to determine whether some of the bullets fired in the Ambassador Hotel's kitchen the night Kennedy and several bystanders were shot came from another gun besides the weapon wielded by Kennedy's convicted assassin, Sirhan Sirhan.
