## Two Defendants Left in Ray Libel All but two defendants in a libel suit filed by Jerry Ray, brother of convicted assassin James Earl Ray, have been dis-missed by Chief U.S. Dist. Judge Bailey Brown.

Ray, in the suit filed Aug. 31, claims he was libeled by the author and publisher of the book. The Making of an Assassin Ray sought \$750,000 from each defendant, which included Little, Brown & Co.; George McMillan, the author; W. Henry Haile, a former assistant state attorney

general; and author William Bradford Huie.
