Dear Jim:

Yesterday the committee was here (Sprague) and two others. We ~~went~~<sup>went</sup> into my actions during April 4th 1968 and not much else. They ask for attorneys waivers and we agreed to give them, Foreman's, Eugene, Stanton, Robert Hill, and Huie's if needed possibly via Jay Stein if that's his contract atty. They wanted your release but I declined. What is your position on this, if there is a waiver could they take you into court, not just a subpoena but something I am not familiar with. Anyway my position was that nothing more in the form of waivers would be forthcoming until the committee initiated efforts to get the material Judge Smith (Wash. d.c.) has put under seal, plus other stipulations Kershaw presented the committee. Also, did Fensterwald keep any of the file?

Concluding, there is no hurry about this matter as I intend doing nothing for several months re further waivers, but let me know your position on as it effect you. Also, possibly you should retain Wesberg file as he may be subject to subpoena if the committee decides to play hardball.
